

Council Chamber, June 24, 2009

Hanover Borough Council met in public session Wednesday evening June 24, 2009, 7:30 PM in the Council Chamber of the Hanover Municipal Building, 44 Frederick Street, Hanover, Pennsylvania, as advertised.

President Gerken convened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag followed by a moment of silence.

On roll call the following members of Council answered as present: Mr. McLin, Mr. Delzingaro, Mr. Leppo, Mrs. Griffin, Mrs. Stonesifer, Mr. Funk, Mrs. Hoff, Ms. Hormel, Mr. Eline, and Mr. Gerken; Mayor Brown; Solicitor McKonly; and Manager-Assistant Secretary Rebert.

It was moved by Mr. Delzingaro, seconded by Mr. Eline, that Council approve the minutes of the meetings of May 27, 2009 and June 10, 2009 as presented. The motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Funk, seconded by Mr. Leppo that Council accept for filing the reports of the Fire Commissioner, the Mayor and the Borough Manager. The motion carried.

**REPORTS OF THE STANDING COMMITTEES**

**Finance & Personnel Committee – Mr. McLin**

It was moved by Mr. McLin, seconded by Mr. Leppo, that Council authorize the proper officers of The Borough of Hanover to enter into a contract amendment with ADP for Cobra Serve Notifications increasing fees 4% for 2009. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. McLin, seconded by Ms. Hormel that Council charge 2009 Real Estate Tax Collector Leroy Wentz, 217 Frederick Street, Hanover, Pennsylvania to credit and charge additional real estate taxes per the York County Tax Assessment Office Report of June 2, 2009 as follows:

**Planning & Traffic Committee – Ms. Hormel**

It was moved by Ms. Hormel, seconded by Mr. Delzingaro that Council authorize the proper officers of The Borough of Hanover to enter into an Agreement with Royal Farms, 3611 Roland Avenue, Baltimore, Maryland to assure the construction of public improvements required for the Land Development Plan for the northeast corner of Carlisle Street at Chestnut Street, Hanover, Pennsylvania. Motion carried.

**Public Safety Committee – Mrs. Stonesifer**

It was moved by Mrs. Stonesifer, seconded by Mr. Funk that Council authorize the proper officers of The Borough of Hanover to enter into an Agreement with Union Hook and Ladder Company #33 to provide mutual REIT Services per United's letter of June 9, 2009. Motion carried.

## REPORTS OF THE STANDING COMMITTEES

### Public Service Committee – Mrs. Hoff

It was moved by Mrs. Hoff, seconded by Mrs. Stonesifer that Council approve the following new leases at the Hanover Farmers Market House:

It was moved by Mrs. Hoff, seconded by Mr. Funk that Council approve the request of the Civil War Re-enactors for a banner at 133 Carlisle Street, Hanover, Pennsylvania to be erected July 16, 2009 until August 16, 2009 provided this approval is for the Battle of Hanover Re-enactment event only and is not to be shared with any other group. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mrs. Hoff, seconded by Mr. Funk that Council approve the use of the 6,000 gallon tank water trailer by the Civil War Re-enactors August 13, 2009 at Codorus State Park per their letter of June 19, 2009. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mrs. Hoff, seconded by Mrs. Stonesifer that Council approve the request of the Potter's House to hold a public concert in Wirt Park, Saturday June 27, 2009, 5:30 PM to 8:30 PM provided the music is controlled to the park area and the park is cleaned of trash-litter following the event. Motion carried.

### VIDEO PROGRESS REPORT

Mr. Rebert showed a Spike Rorrer slide show of Gregory Construction equipment on Second Street, Conewago Township starting construction of the sewer interceptor line; public works mechanics servicing refuse trucks, fire equipment, and water department equipment; maintenance improvements to Moul Field recreation facilities; street painting crews; and morning league baseball – softball instruction.

### MAYOR'S REPORT

Matthew Waltersdorf was sworn in as a new probationary Patrolman by Mayor Brown. Council Members welcomed Mr. Waltersdorf to the Borough and congratulated him on his appointment.

### OTHER MATTERS

The widening of Wilson Avenue from Moul Avenue to Industrial Drive was discussed. Council directed staff to use plastic stormwater pipe and install it for now, between the school district driveways at Washington Street Elementary School/Hanover High School and the lower Hanover High School driveway.

Council's Sewer Committee reported on their review of the maintenance work to be performed to empty the digesters, repair valves and piping, and dispose of sludge and grit in the digesters with Synagro. Council agreed with the committee's recommendation to pursue this work and directed staff to see the maintenance is performed per the proposal by Synagro.

Council adjourned at 8:10 PM.
